














5. How many years have you been visiting Innisfil Beach Park?











10. How long do you visit?





"It does not feel like residents have any place on weekends."



"I don't always feel safe there at night."


"The constant garbage laying around and coals left from BBQs." "The parking for residents is still a problem as it is not monitored and people without passes still use the parking spaces."




17. How do you think safety can be improved at the park?




18. Are you ever discouraged from visiting the park because of crowds, traffic, or parking challenges?




